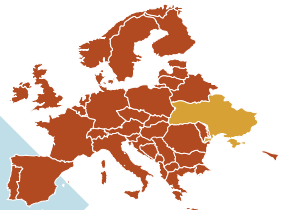
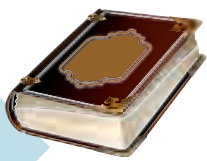


UKRAINE
