When Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24, 2022, Europe’s largest ground war since World War II began. Since then, **more than 13 million Ukrainians** fled their homes.

## Why is food distribution so important in Ukraine?

The Ukrainians who left everything behind when they fled their homes are grateful for aid that helps them with their daily needs. Those who stayed at their homes often have a hard time accessing the food they need. Others may have lost food and other supplies to soldiers raiding their homes.

## The crucial need for aid in Ukraine is ongoing.

Ukraine’s economy is in shambles. In conflict zones, jobs are difficult to find, and food is expensive. CAM staff and workers are delivering food, medicines, and other emergency aid throughout Ukraine and to refugees in nearby countries



## Other ways CAM is helping in Ukraine

- SUPPLYING BLANKETS**, mattresses, and hygiene kits
- DISTRIBUTING** large amounts of Christian literature
- REBUILDING** or **REPAIRING** war-damaged homes
- SUPPLYING FIREWOOD** and heating stoves
- PROVIDING MEDICINES** and medical supplies
